Notes to New Students - Campus Entry Requirements

Dear Students,

Please be reminded that the Government's requirement of Vaccine Pass (VP) for campus entry entered Phase/Stage 3 from 31 May 2022 (ref. <u>Dosage Schedule for Vaccine Pass</u>). Please note that compliance with VP requirement is necessary for campus entry.

Students can use the <u>University card</u> (new students can use the QR code generated upon successful submission of the online Health Declaration before they obtain their University cards) for campus entry on the conditions that:

- Latest provisional vaccine pass, vaccination records or recovery records have been submitted to the Health Declaration (HD) system, in compliance with the Vaccine Pass (VP) requirements
- Recovered persons should upload the relevant recognized proof of recovery in the HD if they have not completed full course of vaccine required by the VP (note that normal requirement will resume six months after recovery, ref. <u>Recovered Persons</u>)
- Those with recognized and valid vaccination medical exemption certificates are required to submit exemption record and COVID negative polymerase chain reaction (PCR) based nucleic acid test result at least once every 7 days to the HD.

Please complete the online <u>Health Declaration Form</u> as required or update whenever your health and/or vaccination status have changed in order to facilitate your campus entry.

If you are unable to submit a valid Health Declaration Form online for whatever reasons, you may enter the campus by producing the proof of your student identify (e.g. letter issued by the University) and scanning the "LeaveHomeSafe" venue code for the VP and compete the <u>Visitor Health Declaration</u> (VHD) (or <u>paper form</u>) before entering campus.

All information submitted via the HD will be handled in strict confidence and according to university data handling guidelines.
